If you are ready to know God and experience His love in a deeper way, here is another simple prayer: "Jesus, God raised You from the dead; You are Lord, and Owner of All. Fill me with Your Spirit to walk in Your love. Thank You!"

To release more of God into your life by improving what and how you think, we suggest you start with Affirmation Magnet A1 on the attached sheet, and say it each day. Many find it best to start saying the Magnets first thing in the morning, but anytime is good. Then there are several options to release the power of these Affirmation Magnets:

- Say the same Affirmation Magnets 1-10 times a day;
- Add another Affirmation Magnet A each week, so that by week 3 you are saying Magnets A1-A3 each day;
- Work up to where you are saying all ten beginning Magnets each day (takes 3-6 minutes each time);
- Work up to where you are saying all ten beginning Affirmation Magnets A at least three times a day;
- Add Psalm 23 and the Our Father (Matthew 6:8-14, 15) to your daily Affirmation Magnets;
- Add Psalm 34, Psalm 37, Psalm 91 and Psalm 112 to your daily Affirmation Magnets;
- Add the complete set of 86 Affirmation Magnets in our book, *OK, God, Now What* (in a stepwise manner).

Make the Affirmation Magnets in Christ with emotion and gladness and, while you are doing it, see or imagine yourself doing or receiving what you are speaking by grace (the free gift of God because He loves you and cannot lie). Make the Affirmation Magnets by speaking out loud, or, at least, silently moving the lips, sometimes fast, for heart writing, and sometimes slower for revelation and understanding. We need both. Mix and match as it seems appropriate. Note: Due to application modifications to convert many of the scriptures into affirmations, these scriptures then become author paraphrases.

The more you say them gladly every day, the more power of God is released. Each is like a prayer where you are saying the end to the beginning. As you repeat these you are writing them on your subconscious mind and, depending upon your diligence and past experience, you will start to see the effects in 2-6 weeks. Don't stop. It is best to continue for at least for 3 months. For the most power in your life, make it a long term habit to say these Affirmation Magnets daily. The biggest changes will come as you do the full program in *OK, GOD, Now What*?

For more results we recommend you get our book, *OK, God, Now What?* In this book we explain more about the science, and biblical origins of these Affirmation Magnets. It also has a lot more Affirmation Magnets for you to use, and more is better.

Full effect comes from saying all the *OK, GOD, Now What*, Christ Affirmation Magnets for 2-6 hours a day for at least 90 days. So saying less will mean it takes longer to see the benefits.

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- A1. **Father God, in the name of Jesus, use these confessions** and affirmations to help me understand and walk in You and Your great work in Jesus better. I am Your son/daughter. Jesus is my Lord. Jesus uses me to save myself and others. ^{2 Cor 13:5; 2 Cor 5:14-6:2} He uses my hands, my mouth, my mind, and my entire life to bring Your salvation to the Earth. Thank You, Lord Jesus, for working in me and through me. Because I once believed Jesus rose from the dead, He is now in me and I am forever His. Jesus' love goes out through me to others, wherever I am. God is good to me, and through me. ^{2 Cor 2:14-16} Thank You, Father, in the name of Jesus. Thank You!
- A2. **Father God, You are causing me to trust You** with all my heart. You are uniting my heart to fear Your name. ^{Ps 86:11} By You working in me, I do not lean on my own understanding, but I acknowledge You in all my ways, and You are directing my paths, to Your glory. ^{Prov 3:5-6} Right now You are filling me with Your words of peace, salvation, reconciliation, forgiveness, redemption, adoption, Holy Spirit power, love, wisdom, mercy, grace, truth and help, for I open my mouth, and You fill my lips, and I speak Your words in love, to Your glory. You, Holy Spirit, are my Helper. I am a co-worker with God in Jesus for good. God loves and cares for me. Thank You, Lord!
- A3. **I believe God raised Jesus** from the dead, therefore the same Holy Spirit who dwells in Jesus dwells in me. ^{Rom 10:8-13; 1 Cor 3:16} Any doubt, lie, fear, sin or unbelief in me I command to hear and obey the voice of the Word of God through me, and **to go now**, in the name of **Jesus Christ of Nazareth**, my Lord, and to be replaced with truth, faith actions, hope, power, *agape/love* and a sound mind. Mind, you operate in the mind of Christ. Heart, receive only God's truth. Mind of the flesh, you are dead in Christ and have no authority over me. Body, you are whole and right in every way; do your job. Thank You, Father God, in the mighty name of Jesus. Thank You!
- A4. **Because Jesus is my Lord and Savior**, I put on Jesus Christ in my thoughts, words and actions; I put on His righteousness, I put on His holiness, and I put on His salvation. ^{Rom 13:14} I have everything He has when He was raised from the dead. I am totally healed—spirit, soul, body, mind, heart, will and emotions into His image. The chastisement of my peace was upon Jesus, ^{Isa 53} the Christ of God and my only Lord, so I freely preach the Gospel, heal the sick, cleanse the lepers, raise the dead, cast out demons, handle poisons or snakes, and walk in blessing and prosperity in every part of life. ^{3John 2} I bring order and peace out of chaos. I am a love agent of God for good. ^{Col 1:27}
- A5. **Because I know I am a new creation in Jesus** by faith in His resurrection, I am Col 1:12 “giving thanks (*continually*) unto the Father, which hath *by grace* made *me qualified* to be a *partaker* of the inheritance of the saints in light: 13 who hath delivered *me* from the power of darkness, and hath translated *me* into the kingdom of his *agape/dear* Son: 14 in whom *I* have redemption through *Jesus'* blood, even the forgiveness (*remission, removal, purging, obliteration and putting away*) of sins: 15 who is the image of the invisible God, the firstborn of every creature.” I make the world a better place all the time in, by, through and with Jesus, to the glory of Father God.
- A6. **For greater is Jesus Christ who is in me** than he who is in the world. ^{1 John 4:4} I do all things through Jesus Christ who strengthens me, and Father God meets all my *aiteo* prayer requirements and demands, per His covenant promise, according to His riches in glory by Christ Jesus, ^{Phil 4:13} for I am made the righteousness of Father God in Christ Jesus, ^{2 Cor 5:21} as a permanent gift, by grace, through faith in His blood. Rom 11:29: “For the gifts and calling of God are without repentance.” I keep myself stirred up by faith actions in God's Spirit of power, love and a right mind just like Jesus has ^{1 Tim 1:7} with continual and godly thanksgiving, praise and joy. Thank You, Father God!
- A7. **The love of God is shed by Holy Spirit** in my heart ^{Rom 5:5; 2Cor 1:22} and directs me to good works and healing all who are oppressed (*under the active rule and lordship*) of the devil, for God is with me and in me in all I do in Him. ^{Rom 16:20} I delight to do God's will in all ways. I believe Father God, for He and His Word are one. Therefore all good things of God's Word, the Bible, are possible to me. As Jesus is, so am I in the world right now. ^{1 John 4:17}
- A8. **Jesus Christ is in me, so the work of my hands are blessed**, for I lay hands on the sick, and they recover totally, right then, by Holy Spirit power. Whatever good I do prospers to the goodness of the Lord. I do greater works than Jesus, for He has gone to the Father and has obtained Holy Spirit for me. ^{John 14:12} Jesus speaks through me as I speak like Him, and He works healings, miracles, blessings and answers by me. THANK YOU, LORD JESUS!
- A9. **All good things of God are possible to me**, for I believe God, who cannot lie in His Bible promises. ^{Mk 9:23} Thank You, Lord Jesus. Praise You, Lord Jesus, for Your mighty triumph by the cross and resurrection! Thank You!
- A10. **No matter what happens to me or others**, I keep my trust BY FAITH ACTIONS in God by thanksgiving, praise and joy using the Bible as my song book. ^{Eph 5:14-21} I meditate in God and His goodness towards me in Jesus three times a day, no matter where I am or what I am doing. When trouble comes I go to the Lord first, and I keep my heart fixed on His goodness towards me. ^{Ps 122:7} Thank You, Father, that You love me so much You had Jesus die for me that I might be Your love agent on the earth, and with You forever. I continually encourage and build up others for love and good. I do not get offended. I forgive and bless easily. I pray for and bless for those who hurt me. ^{Matt 5:44} Thank You, Father God, for Your power in me to rightly love the unlovely and weak. PRAISE YOU, FATHER GOD, FOR YOUR GOODNESS TO ME! THANK YOU! IN THE NAME OF JESUS, THANK YOU!

Bonus Material:

Christian Worker's Confession

Because God commands: 1 Cor 15:57 "But thanks be to God, which giveth us the victory through our Lord Jesus Christ. 58 Therefore, my *agape*/beloved brethren, be ye steadfast, unmovable, always abounding in the (*faith-action*) work of the Lord, forasmuch as ye know that your (*faith-action*) labour is not in vain in the Lord."

Therefore I will stay to win; I will not give up; I will keep proclaiming Jesus' great name in faith actions until His and my enemies bow in defeat and submission to the glory of God. Eph 3:10 "To the intent that now unto the principalities and powers in heavenly places might be known by the church the manifold wisdom of God, 11 according to the eternal purpose which he purposed in Christ Jesus our Lord: 12 in whom we have boldness and access with confidence by the faith (actions) in him (Jesus)."

I will not tolerate the devil and his works to rule anywhere I find them; I will be who Jesus says I am: Luke 10:19 "Behold (*stop and make this change your life*), I give unto you power (*authority, commission, pre-permission and all the resources of heaven*) to tread on (*crush, destroy and remove from power*) serpents and scorpions, and over all the power (*ability and works*) of the enemy: and nothing shall by any means hurt you. 20 Notwithstanding in this rejoice not, that the spirits are subject unto you; but rather rejoice, because your names are written in heaven." Thank You, Jesus! Yahoo!

Knowing God is not teaching me a lesson in troubles; He is encouraging and waiting for me to stand up in Jesus, and teach the devil a lesson. Knowing the healing is done, I now go for it with continued faith actions until I get it.

Knowing this is not about seeing what God will do; it is proclaiming this is what will be by the promise of God and enforcing it with faith actions in and by the name of Jesus until it is manifest, knowing no labor in the Lord is in vain. Thank You, Jesus! Yahoo!

Affirmation Magnet B: You, Father God, have made me a son, and because I am a son, You have sent forth the Spirit of Your Son, Jesus Christ, into my heart, crying, Abba, Daddy, Father to You. Right now, by You, Father God, empowering my word, I am pulling down every evil stronghold, casting out every vain imagination and every high thing in me that exalts itself against the knowledge of You, Father God, and bringing into captivity my every thought into the obedience of Christ, and walking in glad agreement with Holy Spirit. Eph 1:17 ... The God of my Lord Jesus Christ, the Father of glory, *has given me* His spirit of wisdom and revelation in the knowledge of him: 18 the eyes of *my* understanding *continuously* being enlightened; and *I continually grow in* knowing what is the hope of his calling, and what the riches of the glory of his inheritance in the saints, 19 and what is the exceeding greatness of his power to *me* who believes *by faith actions*, according to the working of his mighty power, 20 which he wrought in Christ, when he raised him from the dead, and set him at his own right hand in the heavenly places, 21 far above all principality, and power, and might, and dominion, and every name that is named, not only in this world, but also in that which is to come: 22 and hath put all things under his feet, and gave him to be the head over all things to the church *of which I am a part*, 23 which is his body, the fullness of him that filleth all in all. *My heart is filled with the triumph of Christ in the call of God in my life! Yahoo! Hooray! Yahoo!*

Faith Actions

The Greek Bible word translated as faith, *pistis* (Strong's NT 4102), is based on a verb, *pisteuo* (Strong's NT 4100). The original language words of *aman* (Hebrew Strong's OT 539), and *pisteuo* translated as believe are verbs, indicating action, and both mean "continued actions to nurture, re-persuade, maintain and hold in your heart, and against the devil, and the current negative reality and thoughts, the assertions of the promises of God, unto exuberant behaviors." The noun *pistis*, translated as *faith*, means "to be in this holding and nurturing process of *pisteuo* believing." This process or behaviors of *pisteuo-aman* believing are called "*faith actions*."

This biblical believing, or faith, includes three main elements:

1. The Bible facts of God and His goodness in His Bible promises, especially as seen in our redemption in the work of Jesus, the nature and character of God as seen in Jesus, and the promises of God in the Bible.
2. The exuberant faith or believing actions of applying, celebrating and enforcing these facts to the various situations of life BEFORE and UNTIL you see the promises of God manifest on earth in this life, i.e., "not slothful" (Heb 6:12). Note: Doing this element in trials and temptations is included in terms like "having faith," "trusting God," "standing on the Word," "stirring up," and "loving God."
3. The current status of your strength, true confidence, nurturing or adherence to faith facts and actions, in the face of conflicting information, threats, negative feelings and offenses with stability, joy and continued faith actions.

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The supporting actions of faith or believing are found throughout the Bible and summarized here. These are the things we do that mix the Word of God into our hearts and release *zoe* life for blessing (Heb 4:2). The only faith action that appears to be unique in emphasis in the New Testament is speaking in Holy Spirit tongues, and of course the shift from the repetitive temple sacrifices to the one-time sacrifice of Jesus.

Faith Actions: (The following is not exhaustive and some may be duplicative for clarity.) The basic actions or elements of believing/faith actions are to take the information of the “faith,” in the covenant promises of God (2 Cor 1:20), our Redemption in the blood of Jesus (Eph 1:7; Col 1:14; Heb 9:12-14; Rev 12:11), and established that God is good, His mercy and grace are everlasting, and His truth endures and triumphs over all generations (Ps 100:5; 34:8; 86:5; 118:29), and make this biblical information stir you up into exuberant thanksgiving (2 Cor 4:15; Eph 5:20; Col 1:12; 3:17, 1 Thess 5:18), praise (Heb 13:15), joy (Phil 4:4; 1 Thess 5:16), blessings (James 1:9-10), courage (Josh 1:5-11; Ps 31:24; Acts 28:15), patience/consistency (Luke 21:19; James 1:2, 4; Heb 10:36), magnetizing your heart to God with affirmations of God’s truth (Heb 3:1; Ps 1:2; Ps 105:1; Hab 2:2), *aiteo* commands in prayer as if God were speaking through you (2 Cor 4:13; Matt 6:8-13; 7:7-11; John 14:13-14; 15:7-8; 16:23-24; Phil 4:4-9; 2 Cor 4:13; 1 John 5:14-16), right fasting (Matt 6:18), right Holy Communion (1 Cor 11:30), operating gifts of Holy Spirit, especially prophecy and diverse tongues (1 Cor 12 and 14), Bible study and meditation by chewing the Word in your mouth to manifesting every aspect of salvation as needed to show yourself an approved workman of God (2 Tim 2:15; Josh 1:8; Ps 119:97; Ps 143:5) and able to manifest any aspect of salvation as needed (2 Tim 3:15, 2 Cor 1:20; 1 Tim 4:15), right consideration and self-talk, like Abraham did (Rom 4:12-21; Heb 3:1), recalling and telling of God’s recorded miracles and testimonies (Ps 77:10-12; 78:3-7; 105:1; 119:99; 111:4; 143:5; 145:12; Isa 38:19; 63:7; Jonah 2:7; Matt 22:29; 2 Cor 1:4; Rev 12:11); active patience in continual faith actions (Rom 5, James 1; Phil 4:4-9; and 1 Peter 1:5-11), right judgment like Jesus did (Matt 7:2; John 5:30; 7:24 and 12:47), raising/lifting hands to God (Ps 28:2; 63:4; 119:48; 134:2 and Lam 3:41), attacking every worry, fear or anxiety with prayer and thanksgiving (Phil 4:4-9), working faith contracts (Hab 2:2), speaking to yourselves in psalms, hymns and spiritual songs, making melody in your heart to the Lord, giving thanks always for all things of redemption to God the Father in the name of the Lord Jesus, submitting yourselves one to another in the fear of God (Eph 5:19-21), daily exhortations by others or yourself (Heb 3:13), operating all the gifts of Holy Spirit (1 Cor 12 and Rom 12), public reading of the Scriptures (1 Tim 4:13), and doing acts of agape love, all in the name of Jesus (Matt 10:8; 22:39; 28:19-20; Mark 12:31, 16:15-20; and Luke 10:9).

Note: Faith contracts are a written tool where you gather the appropriate scriptures, summarize your commands, and if people are involved, intercession for them, and then keeping it handy for faith actions until the promise manifests. Put it (or them) in a visible place, and every time you go past it (them), repeat with thanksgiving. You can put these on note cards or your electronic devices to have them with you wherever you go. Even better is scheduled faith action reminders of your faith contract(s) on your electronic devices. Your goal is to do faith actions over each faith contract at least twice a day. More is better.

The acts of *agape* love are listed throughout the Bible. We summarize them as *agape*/loving God continually and exclusively with all your heart, mind, soul, strength, believing on the name of Jesus, loving one another as He does, and doing unto others what you would want done unto you. They are to be built on a foundation of gladly *agape*/loving your parents, spouse, children, neighbors and strangers. These acts of *agape* love include gifts, alms, hospitality, respect and kindnesses to others, clothing the naked, feeding the hungry, sheltering the destitute, delivering the poor, attacking worry, encouraging and giving grace to others, speaking so others receive grace to be more like Jesus, overcoming evil with good, seeking first the Kingdom of God for yourself to community and national betterment, evangelism, personal piety, blessing those that curse you and praying for them that despitefully use you, including casting out the devil in and over them, helping widows, orphans, the weak and innocent, working godly justice, and producing the signs of true Jesus believers by operating in the name and power of Jesus to heal the sick, restoring the maimed, blind and deaf, raising the dead, casting out devils and cleansing the lepers as recorded for Jesus and the early believers.

So when someone says, “Have faith,” “Stand on the promises,” “Believe God,” or “Trust God,” your first response should be to start doing faith actions over scripture facts and God’s promises that can apply for that situation, and then commit to a regular schedule of 3-6 hours a day in continual, on a regular daily schedule of multiple events, and as occasion serves, faith actions UNTIL victory. As the psalmist wrote: Psalm 119:164 “**Seven times a day** do I praise Thee for Thy righteous judgments (*against the devil and for my/our/their blessing and prosperity*”). And, of course, see: Psalm 34, Psalm 55:17; Ephesians 5:14-21; Colossians 3:14-17; 1 Thessalonians 5:16-18; and Hebrews 13:15.

PUSH: Pray and Praise Until Something Happens, and keep PUSH-ing in the name of Jesus till you get the full answer.

Knowing: 1 Corinthians 15:58 “Therefore, my beloved brethren, be ye steadfast, unmovable, always abounding in the (*faith action*) work of the Lord, forasmuch as ye know that your (*faith action*) labour is not in vain in the Lord [*i.e., Faith actions always do good in the Lord*]. Colossians 2:7 “Rooted and built up in him (*Jesus*), and established in the faith (*facts*), as ye have been taught, abounding therein with thanksgiving (*faith actions*).”

You Are Forgiven: Some 85 Numbered Scriptures (with a brief Glossary at the end)

John 1:29 “The next day John seeth Jesus coming unto him, and saith, Behold the Lamb of God, **which taketh away the sin of the world.**”

1 Cor 15:3 “For I delivered unto you **first of all** that which I also received, how that **Christ died for our sins** according to the scriptures. 4 And that **he was buried**, and that **he rose again the third day** according to the scriptures.” v17 “And **if Christ be not raised**, your faith is vain; ye are yet in your sins.” v20 “But **now is Christ risen from the dead**, and become the firstfruits of them that slept.”

Gal 1:3 “Grace be to you and peace from God the Father, and from our Lord Jesus Christ, **4 who gave himself for our sins**, that he might deliver us from this present evil world, according to the will of God and our Father: 5 to whom be glory for ever and ever. Amen.”

Eph 1:7 “In whom (*Jesus*) **we have redemption through his blood, the forgiveness of sins**, according to the riches of his grace.”

Col 1:13 “Who hath delivered us from the power of darkness, and hath translated us into the kingdom of his dear Son: 14 in whom **we have redemption through his (*Jesus*) blood, even the forgiveness of sins.**

Col 1:21 “And you, that were sometime alienated (*bitter*) and enemies in your mind by wicked works, yet now **hath he (*Jesus/God*) reconciled** 22 in the body of his (*Jesus*) flesh through death, **to present you holy and unblameable and unreprieveable in his (*God's*) sight.**”

Col 2:13 “And you, being dead in your sins and the uncircumcision of your flesh, hath he (*God*) *zao*/quickened together with him (*Jesus*), **having forgiven you all trespasses.**”

Eph 4:30 “And grieve not the Holy Spirit of God, whereby ye are sealed unto the day of redemption. ...32 And be ye kind one to another, tenderhearted, forgiving one another, even **as God for Christ's sake hath forgiven you.**”

Col 3:12 “Put on therefore, as the elect of God, holy and beloved, bowels of mercies, kindness, humbleness of mind, meekness, longsuffering; 13 forbearing one another, and forgiving one another, if any man have a quarrel against any: **even as Christ forgave you**, so also do ye.”

Eph 5:2 “And walk in love, as Christ also hath loved us, and **hath given himself for us an offering and a sacrifice to God** for a sweetsmelling savour.”

1 Tim 2:5 “For there is one God, and one mediator between God and men, the man Christ Jesus; 6 **who gave himself a ransom for all**, to be testified in due time.”

Heb 7:27 “Who needeth not daily, as those high priests, to offer up sacrifice, first for his own sins, and then for the people's: for **this he (*Jesus*) did once, when he offered up himself.**”

Heb 9:12 “Neither by the blood of goats and calves, but **by his (*Jesus*) own blood he entered in once into the holy place, having obtained eternal redemption for us.**”

Heb 10:10 “By the which will **we are sanctified** through the offering of the body of Jesus Christ **once for all.**”

Heb 9:26 “For then must he often have suffered since the foundation of the world: **but now once** in the end of the world hath he **appeared to put away sin by the sacrifice of himself.**” ...28 So Christ was **once offered** to bear the sins of many...”

1 Peter 1:18 “Forasmuch as ye know that **ye were not redeemed with corruptible things**, as silver and gold, from your vain conversation received by tradition from your fathers; 19 **but with the precious blood of Christ**, as of a lamb without blemish and without spot: 20 who verily was foreordained before the foundation of the world, but was manifest in these last times for you,”

1 Peter 3:18 “For Christ also **hath once suffered for sins**, the just for the unjust, that he might bring us to God, being put to death in the flesh, but *zao*/quickened by the Spirit.”

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Heb 1:3 “(*Jesus*,) who being the brightness of his (*Father God's*) glory, and the express image of his person, and upholding all things by the word of his power, when he (*Jesus*) **had by himself purged our sins**, sat down on the right hand of the Majesty on high.”

Heb 9:11 “But Christ being come an high priest of good things to come, by a greater and more perfect tabernacle, not made with hands, that is to say, not of this building; 12 neither by the blood of goats and calves, but **by his own blood he entered in once** into the holy place, **having obtained eternal redemption** for us.”

Heb 10:10 “By the which will **we are sanctified through the offering of the body of Jesus Christ once for all**. 11 And every priest standeth daily ministering and offering oftentimes the same sacrifices, which can never take away sins: 12 but this man (*Jesus*), **after he had offered one sacrifice for sins for ever**, sat down on the right hand of God.”

Heb 10:14 “**For by one offering he (*Jesus*) hath perfected forever them that are sanctified**. 15 Whereof the Holy Ghost also is a witness to us: for after that he had said before, 16 this is the covenant that I will make with them after those days, saith the Lord, I will put my laws into their hearts, and in their minds will I write them; 17 and their **sins and iniquities will I remember no more**. 18 Now where remission of these (*sins and iniquities*) is, **there is no more offering for sin**.”

Rev 1:5 “And from Jesus Christ, who is the faithful witness, and the first begotten of the dead, and the prince of the kings of the earth. Unto him that loved us, and **washed us from our sins in his own blood**, 6 and hath made us kings and priests unto God and his Father; to him be glory and dominion for ever and ever. Amen.”

Acts 20:28 “Take heed therefore unto yourselves, and to all the flock, over the which the Holy Ghost hath made you overseers, to feed the church of God, which he hath **purchased with his own blood**.”

1 Cor 6:11 “And such were some of you: but **ye are washed, but ye are sanctified, but ye are justified** in the name of the Lord Jesus, and by the Spirit of our God.”

2 Cor 5:20 “Now then we are ambassadors for Christ, as though God did beseech you by us: we pray you in Christ's stead, **be ye reconciled to God**. 21 For he hath made him to be sin for us, who knew no sin; that **we might be made the righteousness of God in him (*Jesus*)**.”

Rom 3:24 “**Being justified freely by his grace through the redemption that is in Christ Jesus**: 25 whom God **hath set forth to be a propitiation** through faith in his blood, to declare his righteousness **for the remission of sins** that are past, through the forbearance of God;”

Rom 4:5 “But to him that worketh not, but **believeth (*by continual right faith actions*) on him that justifieth the ungodly**, his faith (*actions*) are counted for righteousness.”

Rom 4:24 “But for us also, to whom it (*righteousness*) shall be imputed, if we believe on him that raised up Jesus our Lord from the dead; 25 who was **delivered for our offences**, and was **raised [from the dead] again for our justification**. 5:1 Therefore being justified by faith (*actions*), we have peace with God through our Lord Jesus Christ 2 by whom also we have access by faith (*actions*) into this grace wherein we stand, and rejoice in hope of the glory of God.”

Rom 5:6 “For when we were yet without strength, in due time **Christ died for the ungodly**.”

Rom 5:8 “But God commendeth his love toward us, in that, **while we were yet sinners, Christ died for us**. 9 Much more then, **being now justified by his blood**, we shall be *sozo*/saved from wrath through him. 10 For if, when we were enemies, **we were reconciled to God by the death of his Son**, much more, **being reconciled**, we shall be *sozo*/saved by his *zoe*/life. 11 And not only so, but we also joy in God through our Lord Jesus Christ, by whom **we have now received the atonement (*reconciliation*)**.”

Rom 8:33 “Who shall lay any thing to the charge of God's elect? **It is God that justifieth**. 34 Who is he that condemneth? **It is Christ that died**, yea rather, that is risen again, who is even at the right hand of God, **who also maketh intercession for us**.”

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1 John 2:1 “My little children, these things write I unto you, that ye sin not. And if any man sin, **we have an advocate** with the Father, Jesus Christ the righteous: 2 and **he is the propitiation for our sins**: and not for ours only, but **also for the sins of the whole world.**”

1 John 2:12 “I write unto you, little children, because **your sins are forgiven you** for his name's sake.”

1 John 3:5 “And ye know that **he was manifested to take away (remit) our sins**; and in him is no sin.”

1 John 3:16 “Hereby perceive we the love of God, **because he laid down his life for us**: and we ought to lay down our lives for the brethren.”

Acts 13:38 “Be it known unto you therefore, men and brethren, that through this man (*Jesus*) **is preached (proclaimed and demonstrated) unto you the forgiveness (remission) of sins**: 39 and by him all that believe (*by continual right faith actions*) are justified from all things, from which ye could not be justified by the law of Moses.”

Ps 103:1 “Bless the Lord, O my soul: and all that is within me, bless his holy name. 2 Bless the Lord, O my soul, and forget not all his benefits: 3 **who forgiveth all thine iniquities**; who healeth all thy diseases; 4 **who redeemeth thy life** from destruction; who crowneth thee with lovingkindness and tender mercies; 5 who satisfieth thy mouth with good things; so that thy youth is renewed like the eagle's. 6 The Lord executeth righteousness and judgment for all that are oppressed.”

Isa 53:5 “But he (*Jesus*) **was wounded for our transgressions, he was bruised for our iniquities**: the chastisement of our peace was upon him; and with his stripes we are healed. 6 All we like sheep have gone astray; we have turned every one to his own way; and **the Lord hath laid on him the iniquity of us all.**”

1 Peter 2:24 “Who **his own self bare our sins in his own body on the tree**, that we, being dead to sins, should *zao*/live unto righteousness: by whose stripes ye were healed.”

James 5:14 “Is any sick among you? let him call for the elders of the church; and let them pray over him, anointing him with oil in the name of the Lord: 15 and the prayer of faith shall *sozo*/save the sick, and the Lord shall raise him up; and if he have committed sins, **they shall be forgiven him.**”

1 Peter 1:17 “And if ye call on the Father, who without respect of persons judgeth according to every man's work, pass the time of your sojourning here in fear: 18 forasmuch as ye know that ye were not **redeemed** with corruptible things, as silver and gold, from your vain conversation received by tradition from your fathers; 19 **but with the precious blood of Christ**, as of a lamb without blemish and without spot: 20 who verily was foreordained before the foundation of the world, but was manifest in these last times for you,”

1 Peter 3:18 “For **Christ also hath once suffered for sins**, the just for the unjust, that he might bring us to God, being put to death in the flesh, but *zao*/quickened by the Spirit:”

Heb 9:14 “How much more **shall the blood of Christ**, who through the eternal Spirit **offered himself without spot to God**, purge your conscience from dead works [*of the law*] to serve (*worship, breathe*) the *zao*/living God?”

Titus 2:14 “(*Jesus*) who gave himself for us, that **he might redeem us from all iniquity**, and purify unto himself a peculiar people, zealous (*eager, focused, impassioned*) of (*doing*) good (*Jesus-like, by Holy Spirit*) works.”

Titus 3:5 “Not by works of righteousness which we have done, **but according to his mercy he (God) sozo/saved us**, by the washing of regeneration, and renewing of the Holy Ghost; 6 which he shed on us abundantly through Jesus Christ our Saviour; 7 that **being justified by his grace**, we should be made heirs according to the hope of eternal *zoe*/life.”

1 Cor 1:30 “But of him (*God*) **are ye in Christ Jesus**, who of God is made unto us wisdom, and righteousness, and sanctification, **and redemption.**”

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Gal 2:16 “Knowing that a man is not justified (*just as if you had never sinned, will never sin again, connected to God by in-dwelling Holy Spirit to operate just like Jesus in spite of your sins*) by the works of the law, but by the **faith (action) of/concerning** Jesus Christ, even we have believed (*by faith actions*) in Jesus Christ, **that we might be justified by the faith (action) of/concerning Christ**, and not by the works (*animal blood*) of the law: for by the works of the law shall no flesh be justified...20 “**I am (have been) crucified with Christ: nevertheless I zao/live**; yet not I, but Christ *zao/liveth* in me: and the life which I now *zao/live* in the flesh I *zao/live* by faith (*actions concerning*) the Son of God, who *agape/loved* me, and gave himself for me. 21 I do not frustrate the grace of God: for if **righteousness (nature, force, power, life, and connection to God)** come by the law, then Christ is dead in vain.”

Gal 3:13 “Christ **hath redeemed us from the curse of the law**, being made a curse for us: for it is written, Cursed is every one that hangeth on a tree (*the cross*): 14 that the blessing of Abraham might come on the Gentiles through Jesus Christ; **that we might receive the promise (in-dwelling presence and power) of the Spirit through faith (actions).**”

Gal 4:4 “But when the fullness of the time was come, **God sent forth his Son**, made of a woman, made under the law (*a Jew*), 5 to **redeem** them that were under the law (*Jews*), **that we (Jews and Gentiles) might receive the adoption of sons**. 6 And because ye are sons, God hath sent forth the Spirit of his Son into your hearts, crying, Abba, Father. 7 **Wherefore thou art no more a servant, but a son**; and if a son, then an heir of God through Christ.”

Heb 9:26 “For then must he (*Jesus*) often have suffered since the foundation of the world: **but now once** in the end of the world hath he appeared **to put away (remit) sin** by the sacrifice of himself.”

Glossary (New Testament usage):

Believe/Faith: Exuberant actions of thanks, praise, joy, *aiteo* commands, etc. to celebrate, enforce, apply and nurture the facts of our redemption in the blood of Jesus, the nature and character of God, and His promises to release God’s *zoe* life, to manifest those promises into our present life.

Forgive: The decision to not hold or count offenses, sins or failure against someone. A personal decision.

Iniquity: The lusts, desires or refusal to do right to the level of God. Thoughts of independence or seeking power from other than God. Often translated as lawlessness, the refusal to seek the Lord continually by His requirements. Often includes the evil thoughts and the resulting actions or sin with their consequences. Part of greed and idolatry.

Justify: To eternally fix, make right or acceptable. To declare or make just as if you had never sinned, will never sin again, connected to God by in-dwelling Holy Spirit to operate just like Jesus, in spite of any subsequent sins.

Justification: The permeant condition of being declared or made just as if you had never sinned, will never sin again, connected to God by in-dwelling Holy Spirit to operate just like Jesus, in spite of any subsequent sins.

Propitiation/Reconciliation: Removal of all offense or separation to total unity with forced blessings and favor.

Ransom: The price paid to recover ownership, i.e., the blood of Jesus for humanity, past, present and future.

Redeem/Remit: To pay in full for the offense, penalty or failure, to recover ownership. A legal transaction.

Redemption: The state of having been permanently redeemed by the one-time-shed blood of Jesus.

Remission: The state of having all sins and curses paid for by the blood of Jesus.

Righteousness: The force or presence to always do and be right to the level of God unto releasing *zoe* life.

Sanctify/Sanctification: Separated for the exclusive use of God, and qualified by grace to the level of Jesus

Sin/Transgression: Any failure to meet the standard, to miss the mark whether you are aware of it or not, (to be just like Jesus 24x7xforever). Two major kinds are (1) sins of commission, the wrong you do, and (2) sins of omission, the right you did not do.
